

All exhibitors and helpers should be dressed per the following dress code according to what type of goat(s) you are showing. If you have both Boer and Dairy, or are helping show one or the other, there is no need to change clothes between rings. Again, be sure your helpers are dressed accordingly.

To quote a senior ADGA judge, "Please take as much care with your personal appearance and that of your helpers as you do with your dairy (Boer) goats."

All show secretaries and ring stewards should be dressed in a conservative manner such as the exhibitors.

### **Boer Show Dress Code**

Typically black or dark blue jeans/slacks and red polo or nice t-shirt, no holes. Since we are showing in Arizona, Capri and Bermuda shorts are acceptable. Footwear should be closed toed and closed heeled. Hair should be pulled back from face and neatly secured so the goats can't grab it.

### **Dairy Show Dress Code**

Clean white shirt, long (below knee) white or black pants or skirts. Since we are showing in Arizona, Capri and Bermuda shorts are acceptable. Footwear should be closed toed and closed heeled. Hair should be pulled back from face and neatly secured so the goats can't grab it.

### **Unacceptable Attire**

Shorts above the knee, tank/tube/spaghetti strap, halter tops, bare midriffs or any type clothing that is see-through. Oversized or baggy pants. Dangling earrings and necklaces are a safety hazard, please refrain from wearing them in the showing. Please be certain that when you stoop over or kneel, no skin is exposed. No vertical smiles.
